

## CHAPTER 45

## AN ACT TO CORRECT A TRANSPOSITION OF TYPE IN SECTION 520, CONSOLIDATED STATUTES OF NORTH CAROLINA.

*The General Assembly of North Carolina do enact:*

SECTION 1. That section five hundred and twenty (520) of the Consolidated Statutes of North Carolina be and the same is hereby stricken out and repealed, and the following inserted in lieu thereof, to wit:

*Debt for purchase money of land denied.* If the defendant shall deny on his answer that the obligation sued on was for the purchase money of the land described in the complaint, it shall be the duty of the court to submit the issue so joined to the jury. Issue as to debt for purchase money.

SEC. 2. That all laws and clauses of laws in conflict herewith are hereby repealed. Repealing clause.

SEC. 3. That upon ratification this act shall take effect from and after the first day of August, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen. When act effective.

Ratified this the 16th day of February, A.D. 1921.

## CHAPTER 46

## AN ACT MAKING IT UNLAWFUL TO GIVE FALSE FIRE ALARMS.

*The General Assembly of North Carolina do enact:*

SECTION 1. That it shall be unlawful for any person or persons to wantonly and willfully give or cause to be given, or to advise, counsel, or aid and abet any one in giving a false alarm of fire, or to break the glass key protector, or to pull the slide, arm, or lever of any station or signal box of any municipal fire alarm system, except in case of fire, or in any way to willfully interfere with damage, deface, molest, or injure any part or portion of the fire alarm system of any municipality. Acts forbidden.

SEC. 2. Any person violating any of the provisions of this act shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction shall be fined or imprisoned, or both, in the discretion of the court. Misdemeanor.  
Punishment.

SEC. 3. That all laws and clauses of laws in conflict herewith are hereby repealed in so far as the same conflict with the provisions of this act. Repealing clause.

SEC. 4. That this act shall be in force from and after its ratification.
